

Soccer Teams

Schools have soccer **teams**. Teams from different schools play each other.





The game is called *soccer* in North America and several other places. Most of the world calls it *football*.

Playing the Game

A soccer team has eleven players. Players try to get the ball into the other team's **net**. When they do, they score a **goal**.



Working together with members of your team is a big part of soccer.



A player from one team (red) slides in to get the ball from the other team (green).

Some players try to take the ball

from the other team.

They use their feet to get the ball.



- **1** Dribbling–moving the ball small distances with the feet
- **2** Passing—moving the ball to another player
- **3** Tackling–getting the ball from a player on the other team
- **4** Heading–using the head to move the ball
- **5** Shooting–kicking the ball to score a goal

One player on each team stays by the net. They are goalies. Goalies try to stop the ball from going into the net.



Goalies have to think fast and must be very brave. They often dive for the ball.

Goalies can use their hands. They can catch the ball or hit away from the net.




Players may fly through the air to stop a ball.



 - woven string or rope attached to a frame, often used as a goal in sports (p. 8)

sport (n.) a game or contest that requires skill and physical exercise (p. 4)

teams (n.) groups of players on different sides in a sport or other game (p. 5)
